Dears Members of Immanuel Lutheran Church,

In our adult Bible Class, we spent the year studying the Old Testament book of Job. Job and his friends try to answer the question, why do bad things happen to good people? The answer is that we don't know the answer. As Job and his friends learned, God is good, God is just and God is wise and therefore, we need to let God be God because he knows what he is doing. We know that whatever happens to us in our lives, nothing can ever separate us from God's love. After Job lost his health, his wealth and his family, in faith he exclaimed, "The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away, may the name of the Lord be praise."

As we review our lives in 2006, we have to all say that our Lord gave and our Lord took away. Our lives are always a combination of blessings and tribulations. As we review 2006 here at Immanuel, we also have to say that there were mixed blessings. Our Lord gave. In 2006 we were blessed with five new confirmands, five children became members of God's family through the waters of Holy Baptism and we received 4 new members. In 2006 our average weekly Sunday Worship attendance increased from 157 per Sunday to 160 per Sunday. That is an increase of 2%. Our offerings increased from \$197,585 to \$210,922. That is an increase of 7%. We ended the year receiving almost \$14,000 more in offerings than we spent. What a blessing! And who could begin to count all the blessing that our members receive as they heard and studied the Word of our God! What a blessing to be assured each week that our sins have been forgiven! What a blessing as our Lord used the means of grace to keep us in faith and to help our faith to grow!

But in 2006 our Lord also took away. During 2006 six of our members entered their eternal home in heaven. Last year 18 of our members were transferred or released to other congregations. Actually in 2006 our membership declined from 375 souls to 351 souls. That is a decrease of 6%. Then there were the usual inactive members and the usual maintenance problems. As long as we live in a sin filled world, we can expect a certain amount of trials and tribulations.

But the important thing is not whether our Lord gave or took away in our lives. The important thing is not whether our Lord gave or took away in our congregation. The important thing is that "the name of the Lord was praised." Like Job of old and his friends, no matter what happens in our lives and no matter what happens in our congregation, may we always be ready to praise our God for sending his Son to be our Savior, for forgiving us, for being with us, for loving us and blessing us.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Immanuel congregation generously supports Christian Education by paying three-fourths (:) of the tuition for students attending WELS elementary schools. At present we have four students enrolled at Grace: Alyssa Stowe (7th grade); Jessica Reiter (3rd grade); and Jacob Reiter and Kendra Nast (K). At present we have one student enrolled at Martin Luther: Heidi Frederickson (3rd grade). All members are encouraged to have their children receive a Christian education.

In addition to supporting Christian Education on the elementary level, we support the continued Christian Education of our young people at the Lutheran High School level by paying 50% of tuition. We currently have six children enrolled at Winnebago Lutheran Academy. Braden Frederickson, Jessica Kilsdonk, and Shelby Miller are Seniors; and Alysha Schroeder & Ashley Matsche are Sophomores; and Zachary Stowe is a Freshman at WLA. Immanuel Congregation is a member of the Winnebago Lutheran Academy Association. We also contributed \$500 in 2006 to the Bus Fund which helps supplement the cost of the busing for the students, and \$6,192.00 toward operation of the school. Winnebago Lutheran Academy is located at 475 East Merrill Avenue in Fond du Lac.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

We have 20 students on the rolls at Immanuel this year with an average attendance of 16. Gloria Pagel and Amanda Troudt teach PreK – 1st grades; Edie, Rachel and Matthew Nieman teach 2nd - 4th grades; and Kevin Kilsdonk, Erin Zarter and Zachary Stowe teach 5th – 8th grades. Connie Frederickson is the children's choir director. John Nieman is our Superintendent.

The children enjoy the activities, projects and hands on learning that takes place during our Sunday school sessions. The children have sung for several church services and also did a fantastic job presenting the Christmas service entitled "Still, Still, Still".

BIBLE STUDY

In our Tuesday morning Bible Study we are studying the Old Testament Book of Job. The Book of Job ponders the question, "Why do bad things happen to good people?" One of the oldest books in our Bibles helps us sort out the problem of human suffering and assist us with answering the question, "Where is God when we need him the most?" We get to look behind the scenes of Job's suffering and see how God fits into our experience of pain and sorrow.

Soon we will begin a study of John's three epistles, or letters. These letters are the only triplet books in the Bible. The Apostle Paul wrote his letters like a teacher and James wrote like a pastor. John wrote like a father with a parent's concern for his fellow Christians. He warns the Christians not to be swept away by those claiming to have "new" truths.

We meet each Tuesday morning at 9:30 a.m. There is no formal preparation or homework. We simply read God's Word and attempt with our Lord's help to apply it to our lives, as our Lord fills our hearts with His love and strengthens our faith. You are invited to join us anytime. In my ministry it has been my experience that people who "try" a Bible Study generally find it interesting and stimulating and find themselves coming back regularly. Why not join us some Tuesday morning and give us a "try"? A Bible Information Class, which studies the basic doctrines of the Bible, is also available for people who desire membership at Immanuel. The class schedule is flexible, so contact Pastor, if you are interested.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

"Showdown in the Desert" was the theme for our joint Vacation Bible School which was held at Grace Lutheran Church from July 19th to 23rd. 78 families participated and 25 of those families were non-WELS. 118 students attended. 8 of these students were from Immanuel. Each day over 30 volunteers and five Camp Phillip staff led the children in songs, crafts, snacks, recreation, but most important Bible Time. Thanks to all who helped to make this a great experience.

MEN'S BREAKFAST CLUB

A men's breakfast club meets each Wednesday morning at 9:00 a.m. at the Delta Restaurant on Sawyer Street. We meet each week for Christian discussion and fellowship. If you like to eat, to talk and to be with fellow Christians, you are invited to join us.

LADIES' GUILD

Immanuel Ladies' Guild is an organization of ladies who are communicant members of Immanuel. The purpose of this organization is to further Christian knowledge, mutual understanding and sociability. Our Guild has several missions which we support with regular contributions on a rotation basis and in addition, we again sent \$300 to the African Medical Mission this December. We also assist with the needs and works of charity in our congregation. We meet the 3rd or 4th Tuesday of the month from February through May and September through December.

Activities this past year included a slide presentation and talk by Hazel Drebus on her trip to Antarctica. This was a congregational guest night with many members in attendance for this very enjoyable program. In March we had Pastor John Baumann speak to us on the Hmong Ministry. In April we held our election of officers and brought "baby shower gifts" for Lutherans for Life in Fond du Lac, and sent them a \$100 gift certificate to purchase diapers. We also had a program of questions and answers whereby the ladies could bring questions and Pastor Pagel provided the answers. Ladies' Guild also hosted the annual Easter Breakfast with the help of volunteers from the congregation. To everyone who assisted, we offer a big thank you.

In May we had an Ice Cream Social and were entertained by the WLA Swing Choir. We also purchased, assembled and delivered gift bags to the shut-ins of our congregation. In June, several of the ladies cleaned and organized the church kitchen.

At September's Appetizer and Salad Supper we voted to send \$200 to the Calvary Academy Ministry in Florida. Tony Panske from Garden Gate Floral gave a talk and demonstration on floral arrangement in October. The Guild also hosted the Mission Festival Potluck in October which was well attended and enjoyed by all. In November we held our second annual "Advent by Candlelight" with Stars as the theme for our program of scripture and songs. We were blessed to have people attend from all six Oshkosh WELS congregations.

As in past years, we participated in the Pleasant Acres "Star" program and purchased Christmas gifts for those residents who might otherwise not be remembered at this joyous time of year. We also held our annual Bake and Craft Sale in November, which, with the help of our congregation, was very successful. In December we had our Christmas party at the Delta Restaurant
